"Strive for 5" reading challenge.

Reading Records include: Term dates for the year, year group spellings, times tables and letter formation sheets
The weekly strive for 5 challenge is continuing with week 1 starting Friday 7th September. There is an individual box to sign/comment in each time your child reads with an adult. Staff will check and stamp reading sessions daily. There will continue to be weekly rewards for achieving 'Strive for 5' and half termly rewards. 'Get out of jail free' card (page 3). This will be used the first time your child misses a week. Once used you then have no further chances if you miss a week's Strive for 5.

Strive for 5 really **DOES** make a difference to your child's reading ability which is why this is a whole school initiative. Staff will question children about the texts they have read. Replacement books will cost £5.00.

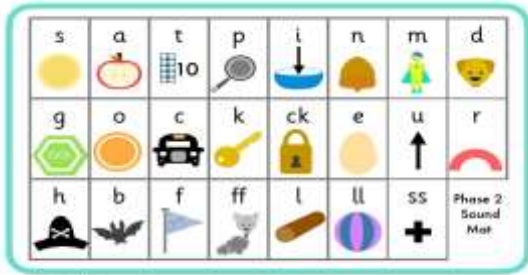
Our first course is a PHONICS course.

It has come to our attention through discussion with the children that many of them are STILL playing online games and computer games which are inappropriate for their age. Not only are children playing these inappropriate games they are then coming in to school, discussing them and re-enacting them!

Fortnite is not suitable for persons under 12.

Some of these games may appear fine on first glance but as players get further in to the games they are exposed to portals to chat rooms where there is no safeguarding. Please protect your children from violence, inappropriate language, sexualised behaviours and links to unknown persons by knowing what they are doing on their computers and not breaking the law by allowing access to age limited games. There are limits on these for good reason!
